<u>SECTION 1.</u> NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF KENT COUNTY, MARYLAND that Chapter 152, Article VIII, is hereby amended §152-35 as follows:

ARTICLE VIII

Property Tax Credit: Commerce Zones

§ 152-33. Definitions; program.

A. Definitions. In this article the following words have the meanings indicated:

COMMERCE ZONE - A priority funding area in Kent County designated by the County Commissioners of Kent County as a commerce zone and adopted by resolution.

NEW, IMPROVED, OR EXPANDED PREMISES - Commercial or industrial real property, including a building or part of a building that has not been previously occupied, where a business entity locates to conduct business.

B. Program. The County Commissioners of Kent County may grant, by law, a property tax credit under this section against the County property tax imposed on or after July 1, 2015, on real property owned by a business entity that meets the requirements specified under this article.

§ 152-34. Qualifications for tax credit.

To qualify for a property tax credit under this section, a business entity shall obtain new, improved, or expanded premises in a commerce zone by:

- A. Purchasing newly constructed premises;
- B. Constructing new premises;
- C. Causing new premises to be constructed; or
- D. Improving existing premises for occupation by the business entity.

§ 152-35. Computation AND EXPIRATION of tax credit.

If a business entity meets the definitions and requirements under §§ 153-33 and 153-34 of this article, the property tax credit granted under this section shall equal a percentage of the amount of County property tax imposed on the assessment of the new, improved, or expanded premises, as follows:

A. Fifty percent for each of the first five taxable years;

- B. Twenty-five percent in taxable years six and seven;
- C. Fifteen percent in taxable years eight through 10; and
- D. Zero percent for each taxable year thereafter-; AND
- A TAX CREDIT GRANTED UNDER THIS ARTICLE ON REAL PROPERTY OWNED Ε. BY A BUSINESS ENTITY IS NON-TRANSFERABLE AND SHALL END ON THE DATE THE PROPERTY IS TRANSFERRED TO ANY SUBSEQUENT PROPERTY OWNER. IN THE TAXABLE YEAR IN WHICH THE TRANSFER OCCURS, THE BUSINESS ENTITY SHALL BE GIVEN A CREDIT PRORATED BASED ON THE NUMBER OF MONTHS THE BUSINESS ENTITY OWNED THE PROPERTY.

A BILL ENTITLED CHR 2-2024 TO RESCIND AND REPLACE THE LAND USE ORDINANCE IN ITS ENTIRETY

SECTION 1.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the County Commissioners of Kent County, Maryland, that the 2024 Ordinance, substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A, is adopted as the official Unified Development Ordinance for Kent County, Maryland, and shall be codified as Chapter 222, Unified Development Ordinance, of the Public Local Laws of Kent County, Maryland.

SECTION 2.

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED by the County Commissioners of Kent County, Maryland, that the Director of the Department of Planning, Housing, and Zoning may correct obvious errors, capitalization, spelling, grammar, section and sub-section headings, and similar matters and may publish the Ordinance by adding or amending covers, title pages, a table of contents, a table of graphics, non-binding matrices as appendices, work flow charts, and other graphics and citizen aids to improve document readability.

SECTION 3.

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED by the County Commissioners of Kent County that this Act shall not include any changes to the Zoning Map, as such changes are being considered separately; property with zoning designations that no longer appear in the 2024 Ordinance shall be governed by the provisions in the 2003 Land Use Ordinance, as amended, until such time as the official Zoning Map is amended.

SECTION 4.

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED by the County Commissioners of Kent County that this Act shall not sunset the provisions adopted under Article III, Section 6. Establishment of Critical Area Line, §§ 1-2, of the 2003 Land Use Ordinance, as amended, and in particular, as amended on February 16, 2021.

SECTION 5.

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED by the County Commissioners of Kent County that this Act shall not affect the Buffer Modified Area Maps, which shall remain in full force and effect; Buffer Modified Area Maps may be amended by separate Act, pursuant to provisions in the Ordinance for such amendments.

SECTION 6.

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED by the County Commissioners of Kent County that this Act shall not affect the Flood Insurance Rate Maps promulgated by FEMA; such will hereby be considered as standalone federal maps and not adopted as part of this Act; and, the County shall rely on the most recent FEMA promulgated maps for provisions and references to such maps in the 2024 Ordinance.

SECTION 7.

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED by the County Commissioners of Kent County that this Act shall be adopted on the <u>57h</u> day of <u>March</u>, 2024; however, the provisions of this Act shall take effect on the <u>157h</u> day of <u>March</u>, 2024, contingent upon review and approval of the Critical Area Commission for the Chesapeake & Atlantic Coastal Bays pursuant to the Md. Code Ann., Natural Resources § 8-1809, as the same may be amended from time to time.



The Kent County Growth Allocation Policy states that "The County Commissioners shall render its decision within ninety (90) days of the hearing." The Commissioners held a hearing on the Growth Allocation on November 28, 2023. MARYLAND, ADOPTED PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY IN THE MARYLAND ANNOTATED CODE, NATURAL RESOURCES ARTICLE § 8-1808, ET SEQ.; THE KENT COUNTY GROWTH ALLOCATION POLICY ADOPTED ON AUGUST 18, 2020; AND THE KENT COUNTY LAND USE ORDINANCE, ARTICLE III, SECTION 1 TO GRANT GROWTH ALLOCATION, SUBJECT TO CERTAIN RESTRICTIONS, CONDITIONS, AND/OR LIMITATIONS AS NOTED IN THE NATURAL RESOURCES ARTICLE, FOR THE RECLASSIFICATION OF 25.678± ACRES OF CRITICAL AREA LANDS FROM RESOURCE CONSERVATION AREA ("RCA") TO INTENSELY DEVELOPED AREA ("IDA"), BEING THAT PORTION OF THE PROPERTY **IDENTIFIED AS PARCEL 102 ON KENT COUNTY TAX MAP 19, AND FURTHER** DESCRIBED IN A DEED RECORDED AMONG THE LAND RECORDS FOR KENT COUNTY, MARYLAND IN LIBER E.H.P. NO. 265, FOLIO 206 (THE "PROPERTY"), WHICH IS CURRENTLY NOT DESIGNATED AS IDA. THE PROPERTY, WHICH IS LOCATED IN THE THIRD ELECTION DISTRICT AND IS ZONED RESOURCE CONSERVATION DISTRICT ("RCD"), IS OWNED BY THE WHARF AT HANDY'S POINT, INC.

BE IT RESOLVED that Growth Allocation is a finite resource and must be managed appropriately so as to meet the current and future needs of the County. Based upon the County Commissioners' review of the exhibits submitted in connection with this matter, the testimony received at the Public Hearing, and the recommendations of the Kent County Planning Commission, the County Commissioners find the following:

- 1. The Applicant's request for Growth Allocation will meet a public need of the County as reflected in the goals and objectives identified in the Kent County Comprehensive Plan; and,
- 2. The proposal will be beneficial for the County, and,
- 3. The applicant's request meets the requirements for the award of Growth Allocation under the applicable State and County ordinances and policies; and
- 4. The Request for Growth Allocation is in keeping with Maryland Annotated Code Natural Resources Article §8-1808.1, as amended.

- 5. The applicant must prepare all documents required for submittal to the Critical Area Commission for the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays as outlined in COMAR 27.01.02.06-1 (Development in the Critical Area: Growth Allocation Submittal Requirements).
- 6. The Final Site Plan shall be generally consistent with the Concept Plan in terms of uses and density.
- 7. The required findings are set forth in detail in the Findings of Fact attached hereto and incorporated herein as "Exhibit A."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the above-described Property shall receive 25.678± acres of Growth Allocation and shall be assigned the Kent County zoning classification of Marine. The Critical Area classification of the Property shall be changed from RCA to IDA. The granting of this Growth Allocation is specifically conditioned upon the restrictions, conditions, and limitations established herein; the Applicant, The Wharf at Handy's Point, Inc., acceptance of them; and their legal enforceability.

Exhibit A FINDINGS OF FACT

In connection with the application of The Wharf at Handy's Point, Inc., for Growth Allocation to change the Chesapeake Bay Critical Area (the "Critical Area") designation of its property from Resource Conservation Area (RCA) to Intensely Developed Area (IDA), which resulted in a public hearing having been held, evidence, testimony, and comments having been received, and in support of the Resolution of today's date granting the Growth Allocation request subject to certain conditions, restrictions, and limitations; the County Commissioners of Kent County, Maryland, make the following findings of fact:

I. THE APPLICATION IS SUFFICIENT IN FORM

The Kent County Growth Allocation Policy sets forth minimum requirements for an application for growth allocation. These include such items as the current and proposed use, the current and proposed critical area designation, concept plan, and site statistics. The "Growth Allocation Submittals" dated March 5, 2024, meets these requirements, and is therefore sufficient in form.

II. SUFFICIENT GROWTH ALLOCATION IS AVAILABLE TO GRANT

Growth Allocation is the number of acres of land in the Critical Area that may be used to create new Limited Development Areas (LDAs) and Intensely Developed Areas (IDAs). Pursuant to §18-1808.1(b) of the Natural Resources Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, the acreage available is equal to five percent (5%) of the County's Resource Conservation Area (RCA). Per the most recent data from the Critical Area Commission, Kent County has 1,110.47 acres of growth allocation remaining. Approximately 25.7 acres of growth allocation are requested for The Wharf at Handy's Point, Inc. Therefore, the County does have sufficient growth allocation available to grant this request.

III. THE PROPOSAL IS CONSISTENT WITH THE KENT COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

- Growth allocation for The Wharf at Handy's Point, Inc. is necessary and desirable to fulfill goals and objectives identified in the Kent County Comprehensive Plan. The relevant provisions of the Comprehensive Plan are enumerated in Applicant's Supplement and Narrative to the Application for Growth Allocation. The proposal will support the goal to maintain and strengthen natural-resource-based industries through the strategy to promote Kent County as a boating center.
- 2. The proposed project will enhance and expand local tourism by allowing an existing marina to improve its facilities through the construction of a new boat storage area and a new septic system employing best available technology. Both facilities will be located farther from the water's edge thus potentially improving water quality.

IV. THE PROPOSAL IS CONSISTENT WITH THE KENT COUNTY GROWTH ALLOCATION POLICY.

- 1. The project is consistent with the goals and intent of the Comprehensive Plan which embodies as one of its critical missions the enhancement, expansion, and diversification of local businesses, especially those that support locally based tourism. The realization of this goal forms the foundation of our Growth Allocation policy.
- 2. The proposed project will pose minimal risk to the environment and will be suitable for the sensitive location in the Critical Area because the project has been designed to relocate existing facilities farther from the water's edge. In addition, the applicant proposes to protect woodlands and habitat with a 300-foot buffer along the waterfront with the exception of 0.6 acres needed to accommodate the new drain field and one potential pathway to provide access to the shoreline.

- 3. The project will be compatible with the surrounding community and land use as a marina has been operating on the site for over thirty-five years. The granting of Growth Allocation is consistent with the County's decision in 2002 to redesignate marinas as Intensely Developed Areas. The proposed expansion of the Marine zone to encompass all of the property owned by the Wharf at Handy's Point, Inc., supports the use of the property for marine purposes.
- 4. The project will minimize negative impact on water quality and habitat through a stateof-the-art on-site wastewater disposal system and improved out-of-water boat storage located farther from the water's edge than the existing storage area.
- 5. The Kent County Growth Allocation policy, approved by the Critical Area Commission, envisions growth in the unincorporated areas of the County only for development of desirable employers or quality amenities; the policy is aimed directly at business development.
- 6. Pursuant to the County's Growth Allocation Policy, the project must accomplish two of the thirteen enumerated standards to mitigate the negative effects caused by higher density development than normally allowed. The Wharf at Handy's Point, Inc., provides public access to Worton Creek by allowing vehicles and trailers using the County's public landing to park at the marina for a fee. In addition, the applicant is proposing to expand habitat for forest interior dwelling birds by carefully selecting areas in which to mitigate for disturbance of the 300-foot buffer.

V. PREREQUSITES FOR GRANTING GROWTH ALLOCATION UNDER COUNTY POLICY HAVE BEEN MET.

 The proposal was submitted to the Kent County Planning Commission for concept plan review and recommendation on growth allocation. On November 2, 2023, the Planning Commission voted unanimously to provide a favorable recommendation of the application as set forth in the letter of Joe Hickman, Chairman, to the County Commissioners dated November 2, 2023. Among other things, the Planning Commission determined that the proposal supports specific objectives in the Comprehensive Plan, that a new septic system will support increased water quality, that the State has verified there are no federally or State listed plant or animals species, that the application is for an extension of an existing IDA and also related to the existing marina uses.

2. A variance, special exception, or conditional use is not required for this proposal.

VI. THE PROPOSAL IS CONSISTENT WITH STATE GROWTH ALLOCATION GUIDELINES.

- 1. Although the current Critical Area designation of a portion of the property is RCA, it is adjacent to existing Marine zoned land, which is an Intensely Developed Area.
- Kent County recognizes that Article III, Section 1 of the Kent County Land Use Ordinance requires Marine zoned land to be designated as an Intensely Developed Area and requires the receipt of Growth Allocation for properties to be rezoned. The County further recognizes the provision regarding adjacency, and notes that the proposed application is for the expansion of an existing IDA. The resulting IDA area will be 39.299± acres.
- The application complies with the requirements of COMAR 27.01.02.06 through .06-4. The applicant has prepared a narrative and site plan that meets the standards set forth in the regulations.
- 4. The applicant is proposing to plant 4.96 acres of forest to mitigate for disturbance of the 300-foot buffer and to address the 10% Rule for the increase in lot coverage. The proposed mitigation has been selected to enhance forest interior dwelling bird habitat on adjacent properties and we believe those offsets provide greater benefits than the 300-foot setback.

The Planning Commission also reviewed suggested findings submitted by the applicant for the County's consideration.



Chestertown-Prospect Street Budget Rationale: The allocated budget for Prospect Street in Chestertown addresses urgent issues within this downtown residential district. The area is characterized by numerous vacant lots and deteriorating abandoned buildings, and this funding will contribute to KAH's ongoing revitalization efforts. The momentum is strong with previous success stories like the completion of an affordable home at 204 N College Ave. and the projected completion of two additional units at 134/136 Prospect St. in 2024. The new 2025 spending aligns with the neighbors to address immediate housing needs and rejuvenate the area, fostering a safer, more affordable, accessible, and sustainable residential community.

Butlertown Budget Rationale: Butlertown is a historic African American community in Worton, MD. Despite its rich history, the area presents unique challenges due to vacant lots within its residential fabric. Building on this success, KAH has acquired additional nearby properties to provide more affordable housing options. The 2025 budget allocation underscores KAH's dedication to continuing to construct and renovate affordable homes and sell them to low-income working families at affordable prices. KAH's efforts focus on preserving this historic community's heritage and character while meeting contemporary housing demands.

Rock Hall, Millington, and Kennedyville Budget Rationale: The following is a budget rationale for Rock Hall, Millington, and Kennedyville. The funds allocated for this project will be used to research housing affordability and community development, including land surveys and housing evaluation for Kent Attainable Housing Phase 3. These investments are aimed at supporting limited-income families in accessing homes at affordable prices. By conducting thorough research into housing affordability challenges and identifying tailored solutions, we can address the specific needs of residents facing financial constraints in these communities. Land surveys and housing evaluations will also enable us to identify suitable sites for affordable housing development, ensuring that limited-income families can access safe and affordable homes. This project underscores our commitment to promoting inclusive and sustainable community development, ensuring that all residents can live in thriving and resilient communities.

Congressional Direct Spending Justification: The allocation of congressional direct spending for KAH in Chestertown, Butlertown, and other Kent County areas is crucial for several reasons. Firstly, Chestertown is the economic center and county seat of Kent County, making it essential to invest in housing initiatives to maintain workforce stability and economic vitality. Secondly, Butlertown's historical significance deserves focused investment to preserve its heritage and support its residents. Thank you for passing along your concern to me regarding the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission's (ASMFC) vote on Addendum II to modify striped bass recreational and commercial management measures in 2024. The more restrictive commercial quota, recreational slot limit, and one fish catch limit will impact commercial striped bass permit holders and portions of the recreational fishery, including the charter boat operators in Maryland.

In January, the ASMFC Striped Bass Board voted on and approved these actions in light of information that identifies the coastwide population of spawning female fish as overfished. This is an issue that the Department has been tracking and discussing with all stakeholders in Maryland through regular meetings with the Tidal Fish Advisory Commission and the Sport Fish Advisory Commission. Furthermore, the 2022 fishing mortality estimates indicate that mortality on striped bass exceeds a level that will allow the stock to rebuild to the 2029 target levels, as agreed to and defined in the Fishery Management Plan, a critical component to the State's sustainable fisheries strategy.

In addition, reproductive success has been below average for the last five years in the Chesapeake Bay and other nursery areas along the coast as demonstrated by data collected in the annual <u>Juvenile Index</u>, or "Young of Year Survey." Given these grim statistics facing the fishery in Maryland's waters and along the Atlantic coast, the Commission recognized that strong measures were needed for implementation in the 2024 season.

Maryland's representation on the ASMFC Board is composed of three Commissioners: Lynn Fegley/proxy Mike Luisi represents DNR as the state agency charged with conservation of fisheries resources, one is a legislator (Delegate Stein/proxy David Sikorski), and one is selected by the governor for a three-year term (H. Russell Dize/proxy Robert T. Brown, Sr.). At the January 2024 Board meeting, Mr. Michael Luisi, Director, Tidal & Coastal Management and Science Branch, DNR offered numerous amendments, as can be found <u>here</u>, intended to maintain for 2024 the two fish catch limit for charter boat captains among other changes that would have mitigated economic impacts this season; each of these amendments was rejected by the Board.

Maryland's compliance with ASMFC's decisions on Addendum II is important for the protection of this incredibly important commercial and recreational fishery in Maryland. Failing a compliance review by the Commission could lead to a full striped bass commercial and recreational moratorium implemented by the Secretaries of the United States Secretaries of Commerce and Interior.

Please know that I am working tirelessly with my staff in Fishing and Boating Services to identify opportunities to mitigate the social and economic impacts that these rule changes will have on the commercial and recreational fishing industry, business owners and all Marylanders, while also successfully managing the conservation and sustainability of striped bass, Maryland's State fish.

We, the County Commissioner of Kent County, Maryland, submit our opposition to the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission's (ASMFC) Addendum II to Amendment 7 of the Interstate Fishery Management Plan (FMP) for Atlantic Striped Bass. We are frustrated with the 1-fish bag limit, the increased slot limit, and the restricted season dates which will negatively affect the Charter Boat Industry. Also, the commercial gill and pound netters will have their total allocation reduced by an additional 7%. These regulations will gravely affect local small business models that operate in the charter boat and commercial fishing industries.

Our constituents are already reporting cancellations and reductions in reserved trips. The economic impact on our County and its waterfront businesses will bear financial losses and erode the economic growth we have worked so hard to develop. For many years, these industries have operated with reductions in harvesting and strict regulatory compliance, yet they have remained in operation. This year's restrictions are the tipping point that will unquestionably force good businesses to close their doors. We respectfully request your assistance to help safeguard the small business community. Kent County is open for business, and we want to keep it that way.
